The College's Registration Committee meets in Plenary Session approximately every other month and regularly reviews registration guidelines and registration related policies. Registration related policies have a review schedule. A review of the College's Language Fluency Policy was initiated in 2022 and the revised policy took effect beginning January 2023. The revised policy includes updated French language tests, inclusion of the general IELTS, and updated language.

1 Risk to the interest of public protection: Pressure to register individuals who do not meet minimum academic requirements. Ensuring that Registration Committee decisions are consistent and supported by reasons. Engaging in the appeals process with the HPARB. Educating prospective applicants about registration requirements on the College's website via FAQ's and other information. Answering application related queries from students and prospective applicants via email and phone. 2 Risk to access to current resources: To mitigate this risk the College's Registration Committee regularly reviews information for applicants and new registrants, and for example, identified the need for a revision to the **Supervision Resource Manual.** 3 Risk to services to applicants and membership: The College identified that its database management and registration application systems were outdated. During 2022 the College initiated work on upgrading these systems. Once the upgrades are implemented, the registration application system will be modernized, and

users will benefit from a more streamlined and user friendly application experience.
